What is a Fire Risk Assessment?

Fire Risk Assessment is a review undertaken of a building in order to assess its fire risk of *hazards* and offer recommendations to make the building safer/compliant. Looking at what, in your work activities and workplace, could cause harm to people from fire. The assessment helps determine *what safety measures are needed* and the chances of a fire occurring and the dangers from fire that the workplace poses for the people who use it.

The FPASA is able to offer this service for commercial, industrial and institutional risks, other than chemical or petrochemical risks, requiring the use of sophisticated mathematical techniques.

Is it necessary?

Section 8(1) of the South African Occupational Health & Safety Act (85 of 1993) clearly states that *“Every employer shall provide and maintain, as far as is reasonably practicable, a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees.”*

“Risks”, are perceived differently by people.

Our Assessment.

Our workplace fire risk assessment team will visit your premises and:

- ◆ Identify and evaluate the fire hazards including people at risk in the event of fire.
- ◆ Assign a fire risk category on an area-by-area approach.
- ◆ Review existing fire safety measures for adequacy and recommend improvements.
- ◆ Document the results in report format with provision for managing and clearing recommendations.
